ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT NO. 01-003 (GUN RANGE REMEDIATION AND REUSE) Applicant/ Property Owner: City of Huntington Beach, Community Services Department Request: To analyze the potential environmental impacts associated with a proposal by the City to remediate the lead contamination that resulted from the prior use of the ±4.9 acre site as a gun range and reuse it as a park element within Central Park. Location: Huntington Central Park (between Goldenwest St. and Gothard St., south of Talbert Ave.) City Contact: Ricky Ramos, Senior Planner
