- D. **CSP:** Edgar stated 2 months gang prevention alternatives to gang involvement with leadership training/Light a Light of Love. 20 kids came and worked event and parade, etc. Exposed the kids to the Huntington Beach Community. 4<sup>th</sup> grade “Fun Day” had 50-60 students. Monika and Laura assisted which exposed kids to CSP and their services and provided various programs each day of the week to keep kids in a positive environment. Winter break will still have Life skills and leadership, and information and referrals too. “I Count” program for the 1<sup>st</sup> time offenders to mitigate vandalism.
