- A. BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF HUNTINGTON VALLEY:** Tanya Hoxsie reported the Boys and Girls Club has secured the funding needed to have summer programs for 2014. She also reported that they will be having an alarm system installed in the FRC. There has been a good number of residents from the Oak View community attending the twilight programs at Golden West College.
- B. CODE ENFORCEMENT:** Al Brady reported he attended OVRP meeting on 3/11/14. There were 150 people in attendance Mollie Grierson facilitated the meeting, breaking the people up into groups for discuss hot to be contributors to the community. Al participated in several of the groups. He spoke to Assistant Principal of Spring View who was concerned about “Vapes” being purchased from vendor trucks on Queens St.
- C. COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT:** CDBG applications have been submitted, and the City is requesting funds on behalf of the Children’s Bureau for the after school programs at the Oak View Family and Community Center.
- D. CSP:** From December to March 450 people have served in the community. The after school programs are thriving. There are 15-20 active participants in the leadership program partnered with the OVRP on community clean-up. They provide one-on-one meetings, Job and career readiness at OVHS, and parenting classes at OVFC, and dealing with gangs. Parent classes are also offered at OVHS. They have had 6 participants complete the “I count” vandalism prevention program and two new referrals.
- E. Office of Business Development:** Simone Slifman reported that applications for Community Development Block Grants are in process. She informed the group that CDBD funding was cut by approximately 3.3% this year.

- H. OAK VIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:** Laura Dale-Pash reported on 3/8/14 the school was vandalized, resulting in school starting two hours late. The crime is under investigation. The school was visited by District personnel and recognized the staff for their commitment and dedication to education. The school is also offering tutoring for small groups of students. This is a very high quality program, and staff is seeing lots of gains with this program. Saturday Academy is also thriving with attendance at OV School usually the highest in the district. There is a heavy push for technology programs for 3rd – 5th graders, and staff is working on a pilot program.

- K. **OAK VIEW RENEWAL PARTNERSHIP:** Iosefa reported that OVRP received a grant from St. Joseph Partnership to build leadership within the community. OVRP is also creating a community core council and the residents have decided to focus on juvenile crime. Staff will work with these leaders to identify issues and solutions to present to St. Josephs, and this information will be used to determine if they can obtain ongoing funding. Iosefa mentioned the community clean-ups and services days are ongoing. Iosefa and Elsa Greenfield met with Gary Foust to determine who will liaise with the Oak View Community after he retires.
