Details:

On the date and time the Huntington Beach Police Department received a call of suspicious circumstances in Bartlett Park. The person calling stated they had seen what they believed to be two bodies as they were walking through the park. Officers arrived and determined there were in fact two deceased males in the park.

Bartlett Park is a rural park located between Coldwater Lane and Beach Blvd south of Yorktown. It is heavily cover in trees and brush and has a series of dirt trails throughout the park. Detectives from the Huntington Beach Police Department are currently on scene conducting an investigation. At this time we cannot confirm a cause of death for either victim nor can we confirm their identity. The detectives do not believe there are any outstanding suspects or danger to the community at this time.

Suspect (deceased) Abraham Felmley - Male 32 years old

Victim – Robert Andres Duran – Male 49 years old – Huntington Beach

The Huntington Beach Police Department is confirming that one of the bodies discovered yesterday at Bartlett Park is Sacramento murder suspect Abraham Felmley. The 32 year Felmley was wanted in connection with a double homicide that occurred Monday in Sacramento County. It is also suspected that Felmley carjacked a 1992 Toyota Camry, which was recovered at the scene in Huntington Beach.

Detectives believe Felmley traveled in the stolen vehicle from northern California to Huntington Beach. They also believe Felmley shot and killed the victim in the heavily wooded park before turning the gun on himself and taking his own life. A weapon was recovered at the scene, but it is

unknown if that weapon was involved in the crime up north. Detectives are still trying to piece together the connection between the victim and Felmley as well as the motive behind the shooting.
